Hannah is the Campaign Director at Beyond Zero Emissions. She is an award winning community organiser, has worked in a variety of environmental and climate organisations, and has a background in International Relations and Economics. Hannah has been working on the Repower Port Augusta research and campaign for the past 12 months and has presented this game-changing proposal to politicians, business and community leaders, and the general public across Australia.

Beyond Zero Emissions Inc. is a not-for-profit research and education organisation known for its work designing and implementing a zero emissions economy for Australia. Its goal is to transform Australia from a 19th century fossil fuel based, emissions intensive, economy to a 21st-century renewable-energy-powered clean-tech economy.

Repower Port Augusta

**electricity generation –
out with the old and in with the new**

Repower Port Augusta is a proposal to replace aging coal plants Playford B and Northern in South Australia with solar thermal and wind power.

Six solar thermal plants and ninety five wind turbines will replace the 4650 GWhrs that the coal plants produce on average (based on 2008-2009 generation levels), which equates to 31% of South Australia's electricity supply requirements.

The proposal would create 1800 jobs, save 5 million tonnes of greenhouse gas emissions a year, eliminate the serious health impacts of coal and gas, and provide energy security and stable electricity prices.

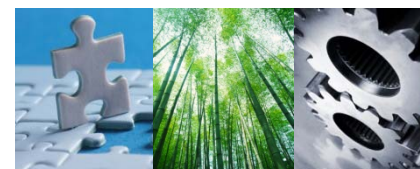

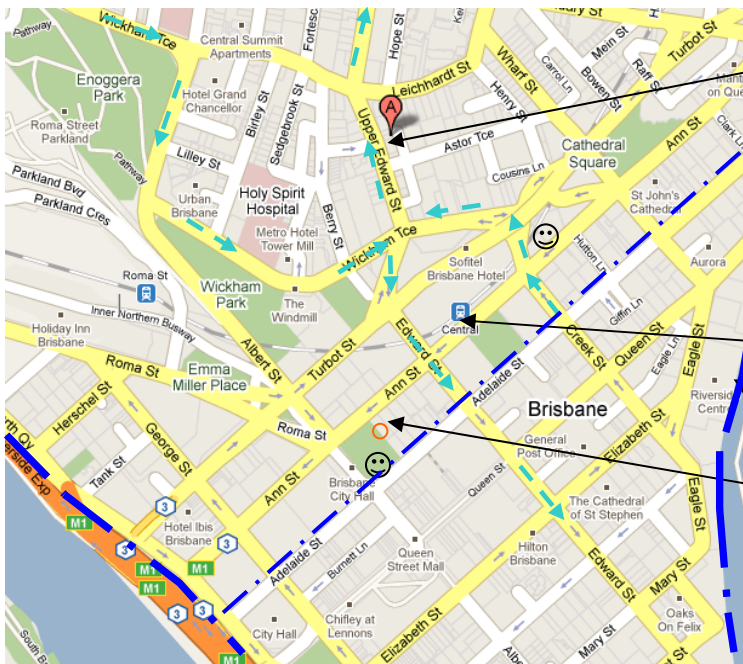
